
There's a lot here to explore. Why not let your interests be your guide through the Revolutionary City? We can help your group plan a visit based on a wide range of subject areas that will inspire and delight – call our group tour representatives for expert help.

Here are just a few WAYS to find YOUR PASSION here:

WOMEN'S PERSPECTIVE—You've heard about founding fathers, now explore the role our founding mothers played. For starters, take the Talk of the Town women's tour around the city, learn the rules of high society at The Polite Academy, and meet the head of Williamsburg's enslaved children's school. Tour the Governor's Palace home to meet his charming wife, Lady Dunmore, and hear about her life with eight children in a palace. See how businesswomen contributed to the local economy and what trades they performed, and join Mrs. Campbell for tea at Christiana Campbell's Tavern. Listen to Mrs. Washington describe the duties of a president's wife, and more.







AFRICAN AMERICAN INTEREST—Slavery was an integral part of 18th-century Virginia society and during this time, half of Williamsburg's population

was black. Meet Ann Wager, head of the Bray School for Negro Children. Learn the importance of story and song in keeping cultural traditions alive in *Papa Said, Mama Said*. Explore pastures, livestock, and the re-creation of daily working life of the middling 18th-century planter and slaves at Great Hopes Plantation.

HISTORIC TRADES & ARTISANS—

Here, nearly 100 masters, journeymen, apprentices, and interpreters practice

more than 30 trades using the tools and techniques of the 18th century. In the re-created industrial complex owned and operated by public armourer James Anderson, visit with blacksmiths, tinsmiths, and artisans working together in support of the Revolutionary War effort. Examine the role of the apothecary as 18th-century medical consultant. The


milliner, shoemaker, cooper, basketmaker, silversmith, wheelwright, and more all played an important role in supporting a community preparing for and engaging in war.


GARDENS—Our 90 acres of gardens and green spaces range from the formal splendor of the Governor's Palace garden to the utilitarian kitchen garden of the James Geddy site to the tranquil Colonial Revival garden at Bassett Hall. Learn how archaeological evidence and historical documents help us re-create period gardens. Discover how gardens reflected status and wealth in the 18th century in a walking tour through gardens along Palace Green. Visit our Colonial Nursery to take home heirloom plants

Stable. Visit the


Presbyterian Meeting

in 1715, where Patrick Henry, Thomas Jefferson, Richard
Henry Lee, George Mason, George Washington, and
George Wythe attended.

ART & ANTIQUES—At the Art Museums of Colonial Williamsburg, spend some time exploring our collection of bold, imaginative pieces of early American decorative arts and three centuries of American furnishings and folk art. Take in our changing exhibitions for an in-depth look and meet a curator for a guided tour of our vast tableware collection or other highlights. Meet the personalities of the 18th century through detailed portraits. Stroll down to Bassett Hall, the home of John D. and Abby Aldrich Rockefeller, Jr., a treasure of folk art. Tour the Governor's Palace to see what treasures the Royal Governors might've enjoyed.

CUISINE & SPIRITS—Visit our demonstration kitchens at the Governor's Palace and Armoury, where we employ 18th-century kitchenware, recipes, and ingredients to make the same meals served in colonial Virginia. Special programming features brewmaking, chocolate making, preserving of foods, and more. Give in to temptation and visit all four of our distinct historic taverns to see how the

patriots dined and socialized. And don't miss the modern cuisine at our contemporary resort restaurants, where our focus on garden-to-guest freshness and innovative cuisine have made Colonial Williamsburg a favorite with discerning diners.

HISTORIC ROOTS—For first-time visitors who want to experience the beginnings of our nation, don't miss: a tour of the opulent Governor's Palace, tavern dining with 18th century recipes at King's Arms or one of our other 3 outstanding historic taverns, a private home like Powell, Geddy, or Randolph House, a visit to a trade site, and a stroll through one of our more than 100 gardens.



EVENING HIGHLIGHTS

When the sun goes down, it's a whole new story in the Revolutionary City! Experience our special evening programming that's a little more spirited, visit a historic tavern for some fun – 18th-century style, visit one of our resort restaurants, catch a performance or movie at the Kimball Theatre.

PIRATES AMONGST US

Blackbeard is dead, and many of his crew have been tried and hanged in Williamsburg. On this walking tour, you'll meet ghosts and ghouls of his crew and hear their true pirate tales. Beware! You may even be tempted to join his spectral band of fellows.



CRY WITCH

You are the jury in this candlelit inquiry into the charges of witchcraft brought against Grace Sherwood in 1706. Question the witnesses, weigh the evidence, and decide the guilt or innocence of "the Virginia Witch."

PAPA SAID, MAMA SAID

Explore African American storytelling tradition in Papa Said, Mama Said, where you'll meet slaves who kept their culture and traditions alive by passing along their songs and stories to the next generations.

SHOPPING—THE OTHER PASTIME

Nine historic shops throughout the Revolutionary City offer 18th-century-style tavernware, one-of-a-kind items handmade by our skilled tradespeople using 18th-century tools and techniques, beautiful keepsake jewelry, colonial clothes, hats, toys, and other children's items. 


